THE ONE TO WATCH

SIPPING LAVENDER TEA from a spun brass teapot in an oatmeal-hued room, it's easy to feel at ease in the home of Gillian Gillies. And that's no accident: the designer is known for creating cosy spaces that make clients want to cocoon. "People are intimately affected by their environments," she says in her lilting Scottish burr. "That's why I love working on vacation homes; it's where people really are themselves. I want to create spaces that make people feel cared for."

Gillian left her native Edinburgh to take a job with a design firm in Glasgow in the late '90s. She spent five years reviving the beauty of the city's "grand old ladies": architectural gems drowning in layers of paint. Then, in 2002, while vacationing in St. Lucia, she fell in love with a Canadian and relocated to Toronto, launching her design practice

The designer has an ongoing love affair with Scottish wool blankets and throws (but definitely not the tartan-on-theshortbread-tin variety). Her signature design flourishes also include linens and silk, tailored furnishings and textural accents like baskets. The colours she favours are historical, slightly muddied tones that act as a foil for the harsh, cold light typical in northern climes. "In Toronto, we're cooped up indoors more than we'd like to admit," she says. "That's why it's important to surround yourself with breathable, textural fabrics and zero-VOC paints that don't affect the air quality." Gillian's interiors are a soothing sanctuary, buffering lake breezes or even a highland gust.
